Good afternoon, Comrades,

The 2020 Zone G6 Youth Education Public Speaking Competition was held on Saturday, March 7, 2020 at Branch #638, Kanata. For the seventh consecutive year Branch #638's generosity as branch host prevailed once again providing the facilities, colour party, volunteers and the cost of the lunch. On behalf of Zone G6, I wish to extend our appreciation and thanks to Branch 638.

Of the eight Zone G6 branches five branches hosted a public speaking competition. As in the past years both the Kanata and West Carleton Branches did not have participants due to the Ottawa School Boards' heavy curriculum and/or lack of volunteers. This year Perth was in a position to host a Youth Education Public Speaking competition after two years of not being able to. Welcome back! The interest in public speaking continues to decrease. The rotating school strikes and teachers' work to rule did have a significant impact on the total number of participants at the branch levels. I ask everyone to do what they can to keep the public speaking competitions alive by considering different ways to increase community awareness of the Youth Education Public Speaking program. Your suggestions are welcome. Observation and Comments:

Why are some Branches holding such large amounts of funds in their Poppy accounts?

Why not use these funds earlier to support Veteran's and Veteran's approved programs?

Poppy Campaign efforts, comments and feed back:

- 1) Poppy Campaign still comes with many varying challenges Lack of Volunteers, Lots of effort with little rewards to a regular hand full of volunteers, Small Branches versus Large Branches, etc.
- 2) Success comes with a good campaign strategy and plan Pick your (battles) sitting locations based on traffic (Costco, Major Grocery Stores, ** LCBO **, Walmart, etc.), train your volunteers, dress for the occasion, use the Cadets, Veterans, Legion Executive Team, get those members out.
- 3) District should offer a training workshop on how to organize an effective Poppy Campaign_and how to engage volunteers.

Now an update on the Poppy Trust Report (2019)

The requirements for the Annual Poppy Reporting for 2019 were presented at the Poppy Chair Seminar Last Fall, however, there was still a lot of misunderstanding and confusion from several Branches. Many reports are being submitted incomplete and level of accuracy not acceptable.

Observations and recommendations:

- 1) Training should be mandatory for all (New and Old) Poppy Chairman, the Branch Treasure and / or anyone else that is involved with pulling numbers together required for the Annual Poppy Reports.
- 2) The Poppy Campaign Reporting Packages needs improvements Should be clearer and easier to use.
- 3) The Poppy Reports required for submission must be simplified and automated, so calculations are carried out on entry Make it easier for those asked to prepare the reports. KISS approach, yet complete and accurate.
- 4) Annual District Training for Poppy Chairman needs improvement Run a formal workshop that will focus on how to complete the needed forms. Possibly use a model Branch as the case study.
- 5) Branch Annual visits to evaluate Poppy Report should be conducted and carried out as a joint event with the annual Branch Audits each year This was done in 2018 and there was great success of getting the information needed and getting it on time.
- 6) Ideally, it would be beneficial to have the Poppy Reporting built into and part of the Branch Audit package. (KTBWOS)
- 7) Each Branch should be graded on these submissions as part of the Branch Audit.
- 8) Branch Presidents should be accountable for the Poppy Financial outcomes and reporting.
- 9) Branch Poppy Chairman owns the responsibility for the poppy financial reporting process. Ensuring that "ALL" the required forms are completed accurately and are submitted on time as requested.
- 10) Branch Treasure is responsible for supporting the Poppy Chair in completing Poppy financial forms with accurate and complete information

The Poppy Campaign and Annual Poppy Financial reporting are critical to our Legions. All those involved in coordinating these efforts must make time and take their roles seriously. If not, then pass on the baton to someone that has the time and willing to make a difference.

Thank you to all the Branches for their cooperation and support to Poppy Campaign and for their efforts to our administrative challenges and governance requirements.

Membership

Branch # 192 continues to maintain a strong membership. For the year 2020 we currently have 384 members of which 327 are paid up. In the last 2 months we have seen 2 transfers and 8 new members.

Poppy

Our 2019 Poppy Campaign went very well. Our total amount received was approximately \$32,000.00. This is an increase from the last two years. Thanks to our great volunteers and the town of Carleton Place.

Veterans Service

Our Branch Service Officer continues to help assist us and our Veterans. Since September she has assisted 11 members for the following:

9 members with Initial appointments

1 member received claim submission and provided recommendations; and

1 deceased members' spouse with the CAF Dependant Pension paperwork, VAC Dependent and SDB.

Finance

The Branch finances are doing well. A new Finance Committee has been formed and we are constantly looking at ways to save money and spend wisely. We continue to pay off our loan from RBC. And we are looking at placing 10% down on the Principal this Summer. We started Catch the Ace last September and it has taken off with a vengeance. We are partnered up with the Carleton Place and District Memorial Hospital Foundation and it has been a huge success. We now can only sell 384 tickets per week due to our Municipal license and we sell out each week. We are now in the process of getting our Provincial license through AGCO. This will take a few months but we are looking forward to it. Things are looking good.

Ways and Means

Our Ways and Means committee continues to come up with ideas to attract a good and steady turn-out for activities. The monthly Breakfast has been going well with an average of 150 people attending per month. As well, our Trivia nights have been a great success. We still continue to have to plan our own Legion events well in advance due to all the rental bookings we are receiving. We will be holding another Tattoo this summer with the Almonte Pipes and Drums to raise funds for the band. More to follow.

Ladies Auxiliary

The Ladies Auxiliary are kept busy with various catering functions, fashion shows, craft & bake sales, a fall harvest dinner last October, and the many funerals that they cater among other things. Their sports are self sufficient, supporting themselves with weekly euchre parties, darts, bake sales and sport tournaments. The Ladies Auxiliary has a very good relationship with the branch and enjoys working together with the Branch on many projects. The LA continues donating funds to help pay with our renovations and upkeep of the building. Last week they just paid to have the electrical in the kitchen to be upgraded.

Constitutions and Bylaws

The New Branch Regulations have been reviewed, approved and posted in the Branch. Nothing else to report.

Sports

We are having a good year with our sports. We had teams playing Darts, Euchre, Cribbage, and Golf. And teams placing to move on to District and Provincial. Branch 240 Report, March 8, 2020

Branch 240 currently has 348 paid members for 2019, only 96.9% of the 359 we had in 2018. We have had a slow start this year, we currently have 279 paid members for 2020. While this is a cause for concern, we are gaining new members to replace those lost by deaths and transfer. Our problem is renewals.

Fundraising continues with the Monthly Breakfast program on the 3rd Saturday of every month from September until June. We continue to do our Wednesday Wing night every Wednesday starting at 5:30pm. We have included chicken fingers and egg rolls to our menu.

We also are continuing the "Catch the Ace" Raffle which has been very successful. Our first draw had the winner taking in over \$7000. Our sixth draw continues to bring in revenue. Currently sitting just under \$4000 for the winner.

Our 9th Annual Pig Roast, will be back this year in June instead of September, this is expected to be a major source of income and all Branches are invited to attend. We also will be operating a beer tent on Canada Day July $1^{\text{st.}}$ We are planning on hosting a Corn Roast in September for Legion Week.

A big thank you from our Sgt of Arms, to the Branches who helped out with the Colour Parties at the Battle of The Atlantic parade in May, and at the Highland Games in August. Presidents Report March 2020

I am pleased to provide a summary of the performance of our branch since my report last fall. As I was unable to physically attend last fall I am unable to attend this Council meeting due to the fact that my job requires me to work on Sunday's. However, the strength of a branch is determined by the strength of it's members and more importantly it's executive members who are there to assist the President and work as a team to run the branch . To that end, my executive members are a President's dream and my First and Second Vice Presidents will be attending this meeting to represent Branch 244.

Financially, our branch continues to grow in a very positive upward position since our albeit scary position it was in a couple of years or so ago. Our latest treasurers report shows us with a healthy balance of over \$50,000 in our general account and all of our bills paid. Catch the Ace donations to date include \$2,000 to GWM hospital, with further donations to Parkinsons, Kid's Help Phone, Del Harper Memorial Ball tournament, Saltos Athletics and over \$10,000 to provide 72 bins filled with recess equipment to six local elementary schools and 2 local high schools for grades 7 and 8.

Our membership numbers are finally on the rebound as well. Since last fall our paid up membership now stands at 478 which is 87% of our renewal target and our total membership stands at 532 with a number of new members in recent months. The combination of an actiive executive with other members supporting our drive to be financially sound while fostering a spirit of having fun has made our branch a much more lively place with a positive atmosphere.

This past years Legion week was an outstanding event with more fun filled and memorable moments than there have been in decades. Our Public relations chair (Sue Doran) has been doing an outstanding job coming up with so many great ideas to promote our Legion and bring awareness to the public about the most important reason we exist.....for our Veterans. To that end, she spearheaded the planting of a beautiful flowering tree as a tribute to our Vets and the installation of a commemorative bench in memory of our long term Vet Eric Devlin who we lost just over a year ago. In addition we had an Emergency Services appreciation dinner which was very well attended and ended with a very informative presentation by guest speaker Dr. Manuela Joannou about her passion...Project Trauma Support which is gaining a lot of traction for PTSD. The week ended with a stop over from the Soldier On Motorcycle and Car Rally and live entertainment in our lounge. The week was one that will be remembered for years to come. Sue has an even bigger week planned for this fall with a the installation of plaques featuring pictures of Veterans from our community being sponsored by their families and relatives. The plaques will be installed throughout our downtown core with the cooperation of the town who have kindly agreed to install them and take them down for a 5 year commitment with no cost to the legion. With plans for a parade, dignitaries and so much more this years Legion Week looks to even surpass last years excitement.

Our branch continues to do well in sports with an ongoing group doing well at cribbage, darts, euchre and other events as they come up.

Our Veterans Services officer continues to do a great job trying to reach out to Veterans in need.

Our Poppy Chair continues to do an outstanding job and our Poppy funds are in good shape. Stacey has a great handle on all aspects of how to promote Poppy sales and how to put those funds to good use. We look forward to seeing that trend continue.

Our Sick and Visiting Chair, First Vice Bob Day is doing an outstanding job visiting our sick and shut in Veterans and members and putting a smile on their faces with every visit.

In closing I have one message to put forward. Royal Canadian Legion Branch 244 is back! We are firing on all cylinders with a common goal to have fun while striving to support the aims and objectives of all Legions. As Eric Devlin always said at the end of his reports....HOY HOY!
