Aida Kostuck, Secretary, Provincial Youth Education Committee has requested Branches provide YE PS competitions dates, times, Branch and location as soon as the competition is scheduled in the event a youth is asking for where the nearest PS competition is she will have a Branch YE PS competition list to refer to. Therefore, I ask each Zone G6 Branch to forward to me their Branch YE PS Competition date, registration times, location and phone number as soon after it is scheduled as possible, please.

In the event the 2022 Public Speaking competitions will proceed, I ask each Branch to pass on the following information to their YE-PS Chair, please:

- •Except for the Public Speaking Contest Statistics form, all other forms need to be dated 2022.
- •A reminder to only use forms and regulations from the package issued the summer of 2021.

In addition to the forms and regulations, the Branch Public Speaking Chair will need to know:

•The <u>absolute deadline</u> to submit your Branch winners for Zone G6 YE PS competition is

<u>Tuesday, March 1, 2022</u>

- •Zone G6 YE PS competition location: Branch #638-Kanata, 70 Hines Rd., Kanata, Ontario Phone: 613-591-5570
- •Dates and locations of the 2022 <u>District</u> and <u>Area</u> level competitions to be announced as soon as is possible .../5

- •Zone G6 Youth Education Public Speaking prize amounts for each of the four categories are:
- -1<sup>st</sup> place \$40.00 / 2<sup>nd</sup> place \$30.00 / 3<sup>rd</sup> place \$20.00
- •Branch prize amounts should not exceed Zone prize amounts. It was agreed among the branches that only if a Branch is in a position/has the resources to increase the prize amounts for public speaking to the suggested amounts below that they do so. Something a Branch may wish to consider before making a prize amount decision is whether they wish to have the same prize amounts for the posters, poems and essays competition.
- -1<sup>st</sup> place \$30.00 / 2<sup>nd</sup> place \$20.00 / 3<sup>rd</sup> place \$10.00

The provision of a public speaking competition for youth is not only one of the best ways we can showcase the Legion in our local communities it is also an opportunity for youth to gain experience, self-confidence and skills!

Suggested ways and means of how best to increase participation if COVID19 protocols and safety measures permit are to:

- •consider forming a Youth Education Committee to support the YE-PS Chair
- establish a contact at each school
- •create a public speaking competition poster notice and post in schools, libraries, etc.
- •when promoting the posters, poems and essays competition highlight public speaking to allow more time for schools to consider, if possible, to incorporate into the school curriculum
- •suggest public speaking as an extracurricular activity in the schools
- approach youth organizations where public speaking may be a badge/award to achieve
- •to increase the reach, particularly home school students it is important to promote in social media in the community via local papers, church bulletins, community centres, stores
- •promote at your legion with posters, newsletters, email, website, social media

Youth Education Public Speaking highlights from the June 24, 2017 minutes of the Provincial Youth Education Committee are:

- •It was moved and seconded that a projector is not allowed at a public speaking competition
- •It was moved and seconded that home-schooled students are allowed to enter the public speaking competition
- •Where to send students: The normal procedure is that students compete at the branches closest to their schools. If a branch is not participating, then students are referred to another branch, under the same zone. If a school is not doing public speaking, then students are referred to the branch closest to their homes. Home schooled students are referred to the branch closest to their homes.

#### **Poppy**

Our 2021 Poppy Campaign is in the planning stage. We are waiting for more guidance from the local Public Health Unit as well as Command for direction / restrictions with running this Campaign, i.e. people allowed to stand out in front of businesses, Remembrance Day restrictions, etc.

#### **Veterans Service**

Our Veterans Service officer has seen an average of 1-2 Veterans per month since the last report

#### **Finance**

The Branch finances are doing very well all things considered. In January, we started our Catch the Ace online lottery partnering back up with the Carleton Place and District Memorial Hospital Foundation and it took off with a vengeance. It ended at Week 26 with the Ace of Spades being drawn by one of our own Legion members. She took home just over \$141,000.00! We are still doing the last financials; however, our profit between both organizations is over \$121,000.00! Just over \$60,000.00 for our Branch. We are now into Week 4 of our current Catch the Ace and it is doing well. We again started our Jackpot at a minimum of \$10,000.00. It is a gamble but it does pay off big for us when we reach over the \$10K mark! On another note, a few of the Executive members attended a zoom seminar from the Ontario Trillium Foundation – Community Building Grant and we will be applying for this before the deadline of 29 September. More to follow on this next report.

#### **Ways and Means**

In August we had our Annual Corn Roast and the attendance was only satisfactory due to the weather. We are planning a Beef on the Bun take out dinner for the 17<sup>th</sup> September. As well, our rental hall bookings are picking up for the Fall into the Winter. This should bring in some good income.

#### **Ladies Auxiliary**

The Ladies Auxiliary have been pretty quiet due to COVID 19. They have not had any catering functions since the beginning of the pandemic.

#### **Constitution and Bylaws**

Nothing to report.

#### **Sports**

This past week we have restarted our Ladies Auxiliary Dart League and Men's drop in Darts on Tuesdays, a Branch Singles Dart League on Wednesdays and the Branch Mixed Dart League on Thursdays, and all are following the COVID protocols with regard to playing Darts. We will monitor the situation and adjust accordingly. This will definitely help with our Bar sales and overall income for the Branch. Hopefully they can play out the Season.

#### **Overall**

It has been pretty quiet since the last report period. We are just starting to reopen our Branch to the public while following the COVID protocols. We keep monitoring our finances on a weekly basis. The hall is booked as a polling station for the federal election on Monday. Ladies' darts will be on Tuesday, Mens' darts and Carpet Bowling on Thursday.
