Good afternoon, Comrades,

The 2023 Zone G6 Youth Education Public Speaking Competition was held on Saturday, March 4, 2023 at Branch #638, Kanata. The first since March 2020 due to the pandemic.

Of the eight Zone G6 branches five branches hosted a public speaking competition. As in the past years, both the Kanata and West Carleton Branches did not have participants due to the Ottawa School Boards' heavy curriculum and/or lack of volunteers. Unfortunately, despite the great efforts the Almonte legion made to promote its 2023 Youth Education Public Speaking competition, there was no interest. The total number of participants entered in the 2023 Zone G6 Youth Education Public Speaking competition was 13. This number is just one less than the total number of 14 participants in 2020. Not too bad at all considering how things are starting to get back to a new normal and COVID19 still exists. There was participation in three of the four categories – Primary, Junior and Intermediate, but none in the Senior category.

Memberships

Capt. A. Roy Brown Branch #192 has seen a drop in membership renewals for this past year due to various reasons from lagging COVID-19 renewals to members passing away during the year. Previous year we had 330 members in good standing compared to 320 currently at this time. We have had more online enrolments than previously; however, we have had a lot of people say that they are still having trouble trying to renew their memberships online. Our Membership Chair has been awesome within our Branch to be in touch with Command to coordinate. We have had roughly 10 members transfer in and we are glad to welcome them into our Branch!

Poppy

Our 2022 campaign went well; thanks for our volunteers being able to stand in the many venues around town to promote our Campaign. We did not participate in the Poppy electronic boxes this past campaign. We managed to collect \$29,997.00 which was significantly more than in prior years.

Veterans Services

Our Veterans Services Officer has seen an average of 2 Veterans per month to help and assist with VAC services up until Christmas. However, she has not seen anyone since but is just a message or phone call away when needed by our Veterans.

She recently retired to civilian life and has enjoyed some time with family and friends while awaiting a call from our Veterans.

Finance

The Branch finances are doing well despite setbacks encountered over the past few years with COVID-19 and our Branch flooding.

On 20th December 2021, our Branch had a major flood in the basement. We have been dealing with insurance and all insurance work has now been completed. The problem found was the main sewer pipe that connects to the Town sewer system rotted out. We had a cost for this repair that was NOT covered by insurance - totalling approximately \$40,000.00! Our Catch the Ace online lottery partnered with the Carleton Place and District Memorial Hospital is doing extremely well. We are in Week 24 and the Jackpot is over \$75,000.00! Thank goodness our Catch the Ace lottery is doing so well as this helped pay for these repairs!! We also donated in December \$31,500.00 from our portion of Catch the Ace proceeds to local charities and organizations helping families in need. Donations through Christmas Food Baskets Campaign, our local Food Bank, Lanark Sea Cadets donation and Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Lanark County to mention a few.

Ways and Means

We are booked up with various events as people are opening up after COVID-19. We are having our St Patty's Day party, a Pipe and Drums Tattoo in June and have many different Branch events planned through the spring into summer. As well, our rental hall bookings are booked solid for weekends right into the Summer. This should bring in some good income.

Ladies Auxiliary

The Ladies Auxiliary have a few events planned over the next few months. They are starting to get busy with catering functions and many Celebrations of Life. We have unfortunately lost quite a few members (recently and in the past few months), so these events will definitely help the L.A. with their income.

Constitution and By-Laws

Nothing to report.

Sports

If someone said, "We are noticing more people coming to play darts", that would be an understatement! The Capt. A. Roy Brown Branch 192 has a Monday Drop-In Dart League, our Ladies Auxiliary Dart League and Men's drop-in darts on Tuesdays, a Branch Singles "Premier" Dart League on Wednesdays, the Branch Mixed Dart League on Thursdays and drop in darts on Sunday. This definitely helps our Bar sales and the overall income for the Branch. Lastly, a shout out to our Branch Dart teams whom during the last District Mixed Dart Tournaments, we took 1st, 2nd and 4th place in Doubles and 4th place in Teams.

Overall

We have been pretty busy dealing with new problems and repairs for our building that is over 50 years old since the last report period.

We just re-opened our Branch FULLY to the public including the basement which recently opened once insurance repairs were completed. We are thankful to now be able to use the downstairs bunker, upstairs main hall and lounge. We continuously monitor our finances on a weekly basis, in efforts to adjust to the current situation as it changes.
