The impact of the COVID Pandemic has brought with it many challenges for all including of course our Legions. Little did we know when we last met in March that the 2020 District G, Area and Provincial public speaking competitions would be canceled due to a pandemic. It is unfortunate our Zone G6 first place winners did not have the opportunity to compete at any of the next levels, but they are still winners thanks to the efforts of Zone G6 branches that participated in the Zone G6 Youth Education Public Speaking competition. Thank you again.

Each Branch should have received the Youth-ed kit for 2020 with a copy of the poster/literary, public speaking and video competition circulars - instructions and forms by the middle of August. An August 17, 2020 memo from Lynn McClellan, Vice-President & Chairman Provincial Youth Education Committee was received regarding how to proceed with the distribution of Youth-Ed materials at schools and the handling and judging of Poster/Literary entries at the branch and abide with the COVID19 pandemic health and safety measures. Shortly, thereafter, an email was received from District "G" Youth Education Chair, Tyrone Seeley with information from a Public Health Inspector on the handling of PP&E.

On August 18, 2020, I received a reply from Comrade Lynn McClellan to my inquiry about Youth Education Public Speaking competitions and the pandemic informing me that as far as the public speaking contests are concerned, he will address that later as it is too early yet to speculate on the COVID19 conditions in the fall and winter and what will be allowed. Once a decision is made it will be forwarded to District "G" Youth Education Chair, Tyrone Seeley. I forwarded this email to all Zone G6 Youth Education Branch Chairs for their information as well as the tentative date for the **2021 Zone G6** Youth Education Public Speaking Competition which is Saturday, March 6, 2021.

In the event the 2021 Public Speaking competitions will proceed, I ask each Branch to pass on the following information to your YE-PS Chair, please:

 Except for the Public Speaking Contest Statistics form, all other forms need to be dated with 2021 • A reminder to only use forms and regulations from the package issued the summer of 2020

## In addition to the forms and regulations, the Branch Public Speaking Chair will need to know:

• The absolute deadline to submit your Branch winners is Tuesday, March 2, 2021

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- Location: Branch #638-Kanata, 70 Hines Rd., Kanata, Ontario Phone: 613-591-5570
- Dates and locations of the 2021 <u>District</u> and <u>Area</u> level competitions to be announced as soon as is possible
- Zone G6 Youth Education Public Speaking prize amounts for each of the four categories are:
- 1st place \$40.00 / 2nd place \$30.00 / 3rd place \$20.00
- Branch prize amounts should not exceed Zone prize amounts. It was agreed among the
  branches that only if a Branch is in a position/has the resources to increase the prize
  amounts for public speaking to the suggested amounts below that they do so.
  Something a Branch may wish to consider before making a prize amount decision is
  whether they wish to have the same prize amounts for the posters, poems and essays
  competition.
  - 1st place \$30.00 / 2nd place \$20.00 / 3rd place \$10

The provision of a public speaking competition for youth is not only one of the best ways we can showcase the Legion in our local communities it is also an opportunity for youth to gain experience, self-confidence and skills!

#### Suggested ways and means of how best to increase participation are to:

- consider forming a Youth Education Committee to support the YE-PS Chair
- establish a contact at each school
- create a public speaking competition poster notice and post in schools, libraries, etc.
- when promoting the posters, poems and essays competition highlight public speaking to allow more time for schools to consider, if possible, to incorporate into the school curriculum
- suggest public speaking as an extracurricular activity in the schools
- approach youth organizations where public speaking may be a badge/award to achieve
- to increase the reach, particularly home school students it is important to promote in social media in the community via local papers, church bulletins, community centres, stores
- promote at your legion with posters, newsletters, email, website, social media

Youth Education Public Speaking highlights from the June 24, 2017 minutes of the Provincial Youth Education Committee are:

- It was moved and seconded that a projector is not allowed at a public speaking competition
- It was moved and seconded that home-schooled students are allowed to enter the public speaking competition
- Where to send students: The normal procedure is that students compete at the branches

closest to their schools. If a branch is not participating, then students are referred to another branch, under the same zone. If a school is not doing public speaking, then students are referred to the branch closest to their homes. Home schooled students are referred to the branch closest to their homes.

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The legion should encourage all students to participate in the public speaking program. There
is no agreement as per the number of students that the school can send but schools with this
query are to be referred to the branch and it is up to the branch to advise the schools on how
many students they can accommodate at the competition

## ZONE COUNCIL SEPT 20,2020.

BRANCH 244 PERTH UPON TAY has had our share of concerns as all branches across the country have since the onslaught of Covid 19. We were fairly well positioned financially just prior to the lockdown as reported in my last report in March of this year. As we are all aware many branches are in a dire financial situation since we reopened to phase 3 due to limited abilities to bring in revenues that we were used to prior to the shut down. The Federal wage subsidy program has helped our branch significantly during these tough times. That stated, we are now looking forward to scary times ahead unless the government finds funds that can benefit us ( and I'm sure all branches) with direct financial assistance to give us the boost we will need to endure this pandemic to the point that we all get back to some sense of normalcy. To that end, Branch 244 is currently holding our own financially but we are going to be dependant on finding income from things like resumption of darts, hall bookings and catch the ace revenues to sustain our long term term financial goals going forward. We can only hope that we are not hit with a second wave in the coming weeks or months.

On a more positive note we are still getting applications for new members. Our current paid up membership totals 427 in good standing and with a little work we can keep those numbers going in the right direction. Early bird renewals are picking up and with our Catch the Ace net profits helping pay for direct branch expenses for now we feel confident that we can keep ourselves in a positive cash flow position. The future certainly has many unknowns.

Due to some hard work from a number of our executive members with the inspiration of Sue Doran we are looking forward to our first Veteran Banner event unfolding in our downtown core on September 26<sup>th</sup>. We will be hosting a "walk about" to much fanfare while we expose the banners of some 100 veterans and 2 Honour Rolls thanks to the cooperation of our town council for the next few years. We have been getting tremendous support from our town and businesses as well as Vet families and we are looking forward to this being an uplifting and ongoing event for years to come.
